From Pastor Kleinschmidt

Te continue the series on how to listen to a sermon this month. Last month I explained how a Scripturally faithful sermon will always include law and gospel. It will convict you of your sins or show you the trouble in your world and then show you your savior, Jesus Christ who has rescued you from sin, death, and the devil.

The next thing to keep in mind is that a sermon may talk about sin or it may talk about Jesus but if it is not applied to you, then it has not done the purpose for which God intended it.

You may look for sermons to be about you. And they rightly should be. Sermons should connect with your life and connect you to the story of Holy

Scripture and show how you are not disconnected from the story of Salvation History as presented in the pages of Holy Scripture. But a sermon that is only about you will leave you feeling empty. If the sermon is only about you

then the pastor is only telling you what you may already know about yourself.

The sermon will not only be about you but it will be for you. That is the heart of the Gospel. It is the work of Jesus Christ for you. The sermon will proclaim and declare that the promises and riches of God are for you and you receive them in your hearing.


We recognize this because we know the Word of God is performative. That means it does what it says. It creates and gives the things of which it speaks.

For example, performative speech is used when God says, "Let there be light." By the words spoken by God, reality is created. In the same way, when you hear that you are forgiven of your sins, it

happens. When you hear that you are one with Christ by faith in him, it is true. When you hear that eternal life is given to **you**, it is given. The performative Word of God is **for you**. It is God doing something in your life that is new. Your life is changed in your hearing of the Word of God.

The entire Small Catechism of Martin Luther is an exercise in giving Jesus for you. The Commandments show you **your sin**. The Apostles' Creed tells you of your God who created, provides, and protects **you**. It tells of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ **for you**. It tells how the Holy Spirit has created faith **for you**. It tells you how to pray and how God answers prayers **for you**. It speaks of how God has called you his own in Holy

Baptism and given the gift of life for vou. It teaches of confession and absolution, the word of forgiveness for you. It tells you about Holy Communion and how the Sacrament of the Altar is Iesus Christ coming to you with bread and wine and his body



and blood **for you** and your forgiveness, life and salvation.

The sermon will distinguish law and gospel and declare that all of these things are **for you**. It's personal, so personal that it is all **for you**! You should listen to what is being declared as **for you**. It should be Jesus **for you**. "**For you**" implies that something is being delivered and so that thing being delivered is very important. Every sermon should deliver Jesus and his free gospel of forgiveness and life **for you**. Every time! There are no exceptions. It isn't truly Christian preaching unless you are hearing Jesus **for you**.

ADVENT SERVICES


Advent services will begin on December 6th. They will be at 6:30pm and there will be a meal served in the Fellowship Hall from 5-6:10pm.

ALL SAINTS' DAY

November 1st is All Saints' Day. The Church remembers in great joy those who have gone before us and have received the blessing of life eternal. The picture on this page is designed to give great comfort to God's people. Death is often a great sadness to those who remain on earth because of the separation between those living and those who have died in the faith. This picture is designed to show that you are most closely connected to those who have died in the faith when you come up to the Communion rail to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus. It is for this reason that the pastor says before Communion, "With angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we laud and magnify your glorious Name, evermore praising you and saying..." Then the people sing the song of the angels from Isaiah 6, "Holy, Holy, Holy!" Those who have died in the faith are numbered in the company of heaven so you are around the Altar with your loved ones who are in heaven. So the next time you approach the Altar rail, be reminded that you join in Communion with Christ not just with the people at St. Jakobi, but also all the saints in heaven

CHURCH BUILDING LOAN BALANCE

The amount owed for the loan to build the new addition as of June 30th was \$1,415,519.20. After our regular payments, the balance at the end of 3rd Quarter is \$1,405,325.47. Thanks be to God for His blessings.

Our new 3-year commitments have been collected. There were 67 commitments made for a total amount of \$308,925. These go from September 2023 through September 2026. This puts us in excellent financial situation as it is more than the loan payments over that same period.
