From Pastor Kleinschmidt

here are a couple of holy days we will celebrate on the weekends at church in the month of September. Our pattern at St. Jakobi is that when a holy day falls on a Sunday, we will celebrate it and make it a part of the focus of the church service. On Sunday, September 14th, the church celebrates Holy Cross Day. On September 21st the church remembers St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist.

I would like to spend some time teaching you about Holy Cross Day. Historically, the date of September 14 comes from the early 4th Century. St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine discovered the cross. Emperor Constantine famously converted to Christianity in 313 and

shortly thereafter issued the Edict of Milan which made Christianity legal in Roman Empire. the Helena Afterwards. travelled to Jerusalem and she is said to have found the actual cross that Jesus died upon. She thought it was real when there was a miraculous healing attributed to the cross. The Church of the Holy Sepulchre was built upon the site where Helena found the cross. That church was dedicated on September 13, 335 and the Holy Cross was shown the next day for the public to see.

With all that said, it's easy to see that 1700 years later we might be a little bit skeptical that Helena actually found the true cross of Jesus. For one, she was looking for it nearly 300 years after the death of Jesus. Martin Luther had some healthy skepticism about this event. "He saw ... the danger of superstition akin to the relic trafficking he so long had opposed. He once quipped that if all the alleged pieces of the 'true cross' were gathered together, it would be enough wood to rebuild Noah's Ark. Rather than fixating on the relics, he

directed attention to the crucified and risen Christ." (*Celebrating the Saints*, Weedon p. 168)

LCMS Pastor Will Weedon writes in his book about Holy Cross Day: "Still, many Lutheran Church orders intentionally chose to retain the festival, and 'Holy Cross' continues to be a popular name for Lutheran congregations to this day. What Lutherans celebrate on Holy Cross Day, however, is not primarily the history of a rediscovered relic attested by miracles. Rather, we celebrate the triumph of our Lord upon the indisputably real cross that once stood on Golgotha. There in love the Father's eternal Son and the Son of the blessed Virgin Mary poured out His life. His blood blotted out the sin of the world. His death proved death's

destruction, as His divine life and love were finally gloriously and indigestible. We celebrate on this festival the way God used and uses suffering to bring blessing; the way He worked and works so contrary to anything human reason could or would ever conceive or anticipate.

"Lutherans, of course, do not deny the possibility that the original cross was the one discovered by St. Helena. Yet, to us, whether that relic is authentic is

not of prime importance. What does matter is that many years ago, under Pontius Pilate, our Lord Jesus was nailed to a tree through His hands and His feet. He was lifted up just as He foretold He would be. And through this unfathomable act of divine love, He still draws all people to Himself through the redemption that is in His blood, the forgiveness of our sins according to the riches of His grace. Better than any relic is the living body and blood of which He imparts to us in the Lord's Supper as the lasting memorial of the holy cross." In the Cross of Christ.

EDUCATION SAVINGS **ENCOURAGEMENT**


