e will soon be starting an exciting new phase at St. Jakobi. Wolf River Lutheran High School is undergoing a Capital Fundraising Campaign to raise money for the construction of a new high school at the corner of 29 and 22 behind the Boarders Inn hotel. In doing this project they have hired



children for the week of Vacation Bible School. There are times that the children are packed quite tightly into the classrooms and it is not conducive to good learning of God's Word. Secondly, it would be nice to have updates to the kitchen and a larger fellowship hall space. Currently, there are some funeral dinners where people eat in

picnic tables outside. Of course a larger eating area and kitchen would benefit the Potato Pancake Dinner too.

association. This is where we come in. We have the opportunity to work with Cornerstone and raise money for our own projects here at St. Jakobi and also help support the Lutheran High School at no cost to us.

You're going to be hearing much in the coming months about how the process is going to work and how you can be involved in this. But first and foremost I want to say that we are not talking about this because we are short on money and not because things aren't looking good in the congregation. In fact, it's quite the opposite. Because of how the Lord has blessed us we have some opportunities in the future to continue the work that He has begun among us.

The current sanctuary, narthex, classroom, and office space was built in 2006. The cost of construction was \$824,000 but the building is worth about \$1.4 million because of the volunteer labor that so many

members of the congregation put into it. We began with loan of about \$557,000 and after nine years of regular payments and some additional principal payments the balance is only about \$300,000. We are about 6 years ahead of our

repayment plan and we only have about 7 years left of regular payments if things continue as they are.

The short of it is that we have made excellent progress in the loan and this is something we can give thanks to God for and give Him all the Glory.

Because of these previous blessings we can talk about trying to pay off the loan at an even quicker pace over the next three years and have it completely paid off. This would be a good thing to do because we have some needs to address.

First, we are in need of more classroom space in the Parish Hall for Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. We currently have about 45 kids in Sunday School every week and about 120

The committee working on this campaign is not suggesting how to fix these issues. We are only bringing them to people's attention. It is our thinking that if we pay off the loan on the church quicker, we can then address these issues sooner rather than later. Again, this is a wonderful problem to have. It means that we have many children that are using the classroom space and the congregation continues to bring new members into fellowship with Christ. We can only talk about this direction of fixing the issues because the Lord has been so generous to us in the past nine years.

I pray that as information begins to come to you in regard to this Capital Fundraising Campaign you will see the benefits it will bring and the needs that it will address. We can't talk about addressing the Parish

Hall until the church is fully paid for. This program can enable us to do that. We could realistically pay off the loan in 3 years and be set up to move into the future as God's people here at St. Jakobi. I would encourage you to pray

for our congregation and for the Lutheran High School and look for more information to be coming to you in the future.

We certainly recall to mind Luther's explanation of the 1st Article of the Creed in the Small Catechism where he says after listing all the earthly things that God gives his people, "All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him."

I rejoice in the undeserved salvation given us in Jesus Christ and the temporal blessings that he bestows upon us.





NEW(ER) HEARING ASSISTANCE DEVICES

We have had hearing assistance devices the past year that can help those people who have trouble hearing at church. These small devices fit in a pocket and there are three different options for how they transmit the sound to you. They can have (1) an in-ear speaker, (2) an over the ear speaker (this works on the outside of a hearing aid), (3) or a hearing loop system. The hearing loop system is worn around your neck and transmits the sound directly to the t-coil of your hearing aid. We've had great reviews of these devices so far. They work! Talk to an usher before church and he will help you get acquainted with these new devices. Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of Christ. (Romans 10:17)
