From Pastor Kleinschmidt

As I write this article the news was recently published that a professor from Harvard Divinity School had found a papyrus manuscript that records, "Jesus said to them, 'My wife...'." The Reuters news article about this was headlined, Was Jesus Married? New papyrus fragment fuels debate.

This is an excellent example of the news media taking an announcement from a scholar and then twisting the headline to make it very sensational. If you only read the headline, then you are left thinking that Jesus was married. The

real truth of the scholar's paper is that the fragment is dated to about 300AD and it may be a copy of another document dated to around 150-200 AD. What this means is that someone writing nearly 300 years after Jesus ascended into heaven is attributing the

words, "my wife" to Jesus. How reliable is that when you consider the overwhelming avalanche of document evidence that the Bible gives to Jesus not being married? The books of the New Testament can be dated between 40AD-93AD. They are very close to the actual events of Jesus' life and they were written by men who had one-on-one interaction with Jesus.

The New Testament does not reveal any evidence of Jesus being married or having any type of romantic involvement with anyone.

Supposedly the document this fragment comes from is what is known as a Gnostic writing. You may have heard of a Gnostic Gospel like the Gospel of Thomas or the Gospel of Judas or Mary Magdalene. Gnostics were people who wanted to be Christians but denied that the body was good. They saw the physical things of the world as intrinsically evil and by death and leaving the body behind, they would be freed to be a spiritual being that was good. The Gnostics were thoroughly condemned by Christians as being Anti-Scriptural. Christianity and the Bible uphold

that God has created all things and at the end of the 6th day He looked at all He had created and said, "It is very good."

The point to take away from all of this is that there will be people who make all sorts of claims about Jesus that contradict Scripture. And they can all be discounted simply by knowing the facts and learning more about the claims. This one little fragment from 300 years after Jesus' life doesn't provide evidence of Him being married. It only says that there was somebody who wanted to present Jesus as married.

Now that said, Scripture does call Jesus the bride-groom. Jesus tells several parables in which he compares himself to a bride-groom. Matthew 25 tells of the 10 virgins who await the coming of the bridegroom (Jesus). And in Revelation 21:9 it says, "Then came one of the seven angels who had the seven

bowls full of the seven last plagues and spoke to me, saying, 'Come, I will show you the Bride, the wife of the Lamb." Jesus is the Lamb in the Book of Revelation. We can rejoice that we are part of the Church of Christ and thus the bride of Jesus and he is our bride-groom who cares for and loves us.

ASK THE PASTOR

Question: I have heard and also read comments like, "When did you accept Jesus? When did you find Jesus? When did you become a Christian?" In some instances these were asked of adults but in others they were referring to children. They went on to state that a young child, teenager or adult was then baptized. Do some religions believe that Jesus is not in a person's life until that person acknowledge Him? Are they not baptized until that time?

Answer: To break this down a little bit, many Christians use the phrase of "accepting Jesus." What this shows is that they believe a person decides to be a Christian. However, in the Small Catechism (3rd Article of Creed) it says, "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ or come to Him but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel." Thus, faith is not a decision, but a gift from God through the work of the Holy Spirit in Word and Sacrament. churches that believe you accept Jesus it is very common that Baptism is withheld until they "accept" Jesus and then baptism becomes a sign to others of their decision. We believe that Baptism gives faith. The Holy Spirit is a work in children and adults alike to give them faith, that is, a relationship with Jesus.

after they were caught in a flash flood. He struggled to find the answer why. He had questioned God so many times before, when faced with difficulties. How could such a tragedy happen to a family with such strong faith? Robert's moving story will challenge you to live a life



of "no regrets", to cherish your loved ones, and to live life to the fullest.
