

From Pastor Kleinschmidt

This year marks the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther posting the 95 Theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Luther posted them on October 31st, 1517 because the following day, November 1st was All Saints' Day when the church would be full and many people could read what he had written.

On June 25th we will also mark another important day in the Reformation. On June 25th, 1530 the Augsburg Confession was presented to the Holy Roman Emperor, Charles V. The Augsburg Confession is a part of the Book of Concord which our congregation pledges itself to as it is a true exposition of what Holy Scripture teaches.

The following is taken from the book *Celebrating the Saints* by William Weeden that explains the significance of the Augsburg Confession and the events that led to its writing and presentation.

"In 1521, called to account for his faith, an Augustinian monk stood alone before the emperor at Worms. Nine tumultuous years later, a crowd of princes and representatives of free cities, with their theologians, stood before the same emperor in Augsburg to account for the faith they had now come to share with that erstwhile monk, Martin Luther. The document they presented and insisted upon reading in its entirety before Charles V that day in 1530 is the foundational confession of the Lutheran Church.

The responsibility for drawing it up fell to Philipp Melancthon, since Luther was outlawed and not allowed to stand before the emperor. Melancthon came to Augsburg with a series of articles already in hand that explained the changes that the Lutheran territories had made in a number of ceremonies and laid out the scriptural reasons for these. However, on arriving in the city, the Lutheran party was astounded at the misinformation spread abroad about them. They were being accused of nearly every ancient heresy. Clearly, they needed more than an explanation of

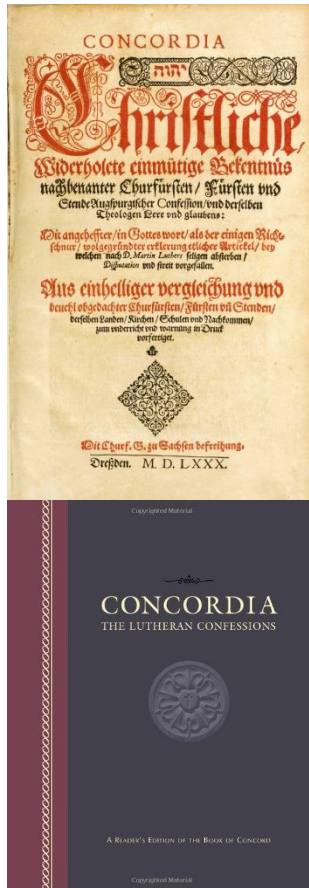
abuses that had been corrected. They needed to show that they were actually not heretical and held to the same catholic and apostolic faith that the Church had always confessed.

So Melancthon, under enormous pressure and in a very short time, drafted the first part of the Augsburg Confession to which he appended the second section on various corrected abuses. The conviction of the Augsburg Confessors is seen clearly here: "This then is nearly a complete summary of our teaching. As can be seen, there is nothing that varies from the Scriptures, or from the Church universal, or from the Church of Rome, as known from its writers. Since this is the case, those who insist that our teachers are to be regarded as heretics are judging harshly" (AC Article XXI, paragraph 1). The entire confession concludes with this assertion: "In doctrine and ceremonies we have received nothing contrary to the Scriptures or the Church universal. It is clear that we have been very careful to make sure no new ungodly doctrine creeps into our churches."

A pervasively irenic spirit and a careful and clear statement of doctrine characterize the Augsburg Confession. It aligns the Lutheran Church solidly with the ancient Church's teaching of Scripture and shows that the various abuses corrected in Lutheran territories on the basis of the Word of God were mostly medieval innovations, unknown in the first centuries. To be a Lutheran Christian remains to this day to be a confessor of the Augsburg Confession" (p. 104-105).

It was common practice that the Augsburg Confession would be included in the preface materials of most large German Bibles.
